The argument

Federalism and democracy operate in a "tense relationship": if not balanced, one of the dimensions may break down.

To keep the balance, several actors, as the Senate, the party system and the Constitutional Courts, play an institutional role to keep the country together and democratic.


But, sometimes, they fail, and democracy declines

This is democratic backsliding


